12 WILLIAM OAKES fought in WW1
Australian Imperial Force (requested CWGC headstone)
Died 21st October 1960 (visiting Swindon from Australia)
It is unusual to find a CWGC gravestone marking the burial of someone who survived the conflict of WW1.
The inscription reads **'Australian Imperial Force' 6092 Private W Oakes 13th Battalion**Died 16th October 1960 Aged 73
Research has revealed a detailed war record. William Oakes was born in Devizes in on September 29th 1887.

He moved with his parents into Springfield Road and then into 24 Lethbridge Road, Swindon. In the 1901 census he is listed as 13 years old and working as a 'Book Finisher' (this ties in with his enlistment document as he states he had completed an apprenticeship in the book trade with Reynolds & Co). William changed professions – he is listed in the 1905 GWR record of employment as working at Swindon Station. However, by the time WW1 broke out he was resident in Marrickville, NSW, Australia, working there as an engine driver. He enlisted in the Australian Imperial Force on 6th March 1916 aged 28. He came to England first on board troop ship 'Wiltshire'. After training in Dorset - from there was shipped to France to fight at Etaples. It is recorded in November 1917 he spent time in a field hospital with scabies. After re-joining his unit to fight, he was badly wounded with gunshot wounds to his chest and arm. The latter causing a badly fractured humerus. He was brought to London War Hospital at Epsom. Eventually he returned, discharged from the Army to Australia in 1918. What we don't know is what happened in the rest of his life before he was buried at Christ Church in 1960. By the time William's father, George Oakes died– the family were living at 172 Marlborough Road. William's mother, Louisa is recorded purchasing a burial plot for George in Christ Church burial ground.

As William's CWGC gravestone states he was 'beloved husband, father and brother' - it is likely there are still descendants living somewhere who could shed light on this part of his story.

William Oakes left Sydney in April 1960 on board ship returning to England –he came alone, the record hints he was a widower by now. The address given for his visit is that in Marlborough Road as mentioned above. He states his intended future residence as Australia and the embarkation list states his intention to 'visit for 4 months'. Sadly, this was not to be – he died on 16 October 1960 and he was interred in Christ Church Burial Ground, Swindon.

William's younger brother Leonard is remembered on the War Memorial in Christ Church. As he was killed in the Battle of the Somme August 1916 his name is engraved on the Thiepval Memorial, Somme, France. Interestingly Private Oakes has a CWGC headstone despite having survived the war and living to the age of 73. It was a special request by the Australian Government and the family.
